I can hardly believe we're already in the third quarter this year. Boy, time flies when you are having fun!! July through September has been extremely hot, and I know there are a lot of you, especially on our job sites, that are ready for cooler weather, me included! Please work safe and drink plenty of fluids. Cooler weather will be here soon!

We are wide open on St. Jude's, Arts + Entertainment, OWA, and Century Tower, just to name a few of our projects, and have bid or budgeted over \$60 million in glass work over the past month. Surely we will get a nice piece of that pie. The Alabama and Florida coasts have really started to get active. We have recently budgeted five high end condo projects and two more federal courthouse projects in Mobile and Pensacola that we are working on with Yates. We are also in the final stages of budget pricing on the Four Seasons (World Trade Center) Project in New Orleans. This would be a joint venture with Zinsel Glass. The Memphis market has also been extremely active with budget pricing on the St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, FedEx Bulk Center, Cook Convention Center, and Highland Office Complex. All of these projects are extralarge glazing projects.

Thanks to all of you that have sent in photos and ideas for the newsletter. Our hopes are always to keep you informed on company happenings and share with you the faces of our company wherever they may be.

Madison-Ridgeland Academy (MRA) - Madison, MS

This project is a three story expansion at Madison-Ridgeland Academy that includes a new middle school and cafeteria. Glass Inc. will be providing roughly 4,500 SF of exterior and interior EFCO Storefront material. The glazing being installed is a 1" SN54 Crystal Grey product. This project also involves a glass handrail, a safety rail, and a few transaction sliders.

Golden Moon Pool – Choctaw, MS

This renovation project in Choctaw, MS started off with demoing the existing aluminum storefront surrounding the pool. We will be installing Kawneer's 1600 Sloped Glazing system with %16" gray glass. This project also includes 140 LF of glass guardrail.

St. Dominic's Emergency Department Expansion – Jackson, MS

St. Dominic's is 2.400 SF of EFCO curtain wall in medium bronze finish, with glazing to be gray tinted tempered and in several locations gray tinted spandrel glass. Hopefully this project will be completed before the end of 2017.

Glazing is IG- double glazed low-e Solarban 60 and 1/4" Clear Temp. Contractor is The ArCon Group MS.
