



FEATURED Johnny Cumberland

Johnny Cumberland—Born and raised in Meridian. Married to Tina for 36 years. Together they have two children, Kylie and Hunter, and two grandchildren, Jaeger and Huntley.

Darren Graham, a former employee, and Johnny were coaching their sons' baseball team together back in 2003. Darren was working for Glass Inc. as an estimator then, and he had encouraged Johnny several times to talk to Robert about working here. "At the time, I was working for Celotex Corporation, and I was content to stay there until I was eligible to retire at the early age of 54." It took Darren almost two years to convince Johnny to sit down with Robert, but when he came and interviewed in early September 2005, it was an immediate connection. "I came to work for Glass Inc. October 17, 2005, and my first day on the job I started working on a glass take-off for the Turquoise project. I thought to myself... man they really do some big glass jobs here... not knowing at the time it was the largest job Glass Inc. had ever done, and the largest still to this day." There were only two other estimators, Darren and Doyle Bryan, who was the Contract Manager at the time. It didn't take Johnny long to feel at home when he discovered they all loved the outdoors. "My nickname back then was MacGyver, and it didn't take me long to figure out that when you are off on one of those Smith Adventure Trips, you will probably need some of those fix-it skills just to survive." Johnny was promoted to Contract Manager in 2011, and he now has six Estimator/Project Managers and two wonderful employees in the Contract Billing department.



In his spare time, Johnny enjoys hunting, fishing, traveling (mostly on hunting and fishing trips) and spending time with his family. Another hobby of Johnny's is building things. He even built his house—his entire house! Johnny cut down the trees and sawmilled and dried his own lumber before he began the building process. "It took me four years from the time I started digging footings to the day we moved in. It was a rewarding experience that I could not have accomplished without the help of my family and a few close friends. I will tell you now, I would never do it that way again."

Johnny and Tina attend NorthPark Church and attribute their successful marriage to "our faith in God and the support of our Church family."
